Aims of the ESB

The European Society of Biomechanics (ESB) is a scientific society established:

- ❖ To encourage, foster, promote and develop research, progress and information concerning the science of biomechanics;
- ❖ To collaborate with other associations and bodies whose efforts and interests are directed at the same objectives as those of the Society itself;
- ❖ To promote the propagation of scientific organizations, governmental and private bodies, both national and international, in order to establish specifications and standards for biomechanics in general;
- ❖ To encourage progress in the field of clinical application of the science of biomechanics in all its aspects, including both research and teaching.

History of the ESB

The European Society of Biomechanics was founded at an interdisciplinary meeting of 20 scientists from 11 countries in Brussels on May 21st, 1976. The society has currently more than 1000 members from over 50 countries.

Activities

Annual Meeting

The European Society of Biomechanics holds an international scientific conference every year to provide the most up to date research in biomechanics and to provide a forum of discussion.

Endorsement

The Society also endorses other related meetings for diffusion to its members and for the possibility for the organizers to use the ESB logo and the phrase "Endorsed by the ESB" in their printed materials. Proposals for endorsements must be submitted to the Meeting Committee Chair.
